

Not all drugs are bad. Some are necessary to help us live normal lives e.g. those required for hypertension or diabetes. Unfortunately, some of the drugs prescribed by doctors can end up having serious side effects. Some of them can lead to dependency or addiction if used incorrectly or for a long time. Lortab is one such drug which is why we offer rehab for Lortab addiction in Kentucky.

What is Lortab?

Lortab is a combination drug mainly used to alleviate moderate to severe pain. It has two main components:

Acetaminophen – This is a non-opioid, low-grade pain reliever that's also the main ingredient in Tylenol.

Hydrocodone – This is an opioid pain reliever that works by changing how the body feels and responds to pain. Opioids are a group of pain-killing drugs that are derived from the opium plant.

When combined, acetaminophen boosts and strengthens the effect of hydrocodone, and the

two work together to provide pain relief. Since this is such a strong drug, it is a legally controlled substance and its use requires a prescription from a doctor.

While addiction isn't a common side-effect of Lortab use, the drug, like other opioids, is highly addictive and should only be used as recommended by a doctor. Most people don't develop addiction since they use it as prescribed for a few days to a week. However, taking a higher amount than prescribed or for longer than prescribed puts individuals at risk of dependency. This is why rehab for Lortab addiction is becoming increasingly common in the country.

Lortab Withdrawal and Detoxification

Due to the physically addictive effects of Lortab, withdrawal and detox should only be done under the supervision of medical professionals. This is because the drug can cause a range of uncomfortable withdrawal symptoms including abdominal pain and cramps, unexpected mood and behavior changes, restlessness, nausea, muscle aches, and trouble falling asleep, among others.


