- Available financing: It's unlikely you'll need to pay the full cost upfront at your facility. Ask if you can make payments over time to lessen the financial burden.
- Loans: You may be able to get a loan from the center to help you afford the treatment.
- Scholarships: There are certain treatment centers that will waive all or some of their program fee for anyone in need.
- Sliding scales: Check if the facility you're considering will adjust the cost of treatment based on your income/need.


